



PARKING

The Tucson Convention Center (TCC) has 1,000 parking spaces that may be utilized for event parking, but most of the closer lots cost \$8. In addition to guest vehicle parking, the TCC can accommodate limousine, truck and RV parking based upon availability. The TCC accepts cash and all major credit cards.

There are several parking garages (most ranging from \$2 to \$8, either by the hour or flat rate) and on street parking (\$1/hour or free after 5 PM and on weekends and holidays) in the area that can be utilized, as well. We suggest not parking in the residential areas because many of the neighborhoods require residential parking permits.

About the Hosts TUCSON ROLLER DERBY





Tucson Roller Derby (TRD) was one of the first modern flat track roller derby leagues, forming initially in 2003, and was an early member of the United Leagues Committee (ULC), the precursor to the WFTDA. Tucson had the honor of hosting the first-ever WFTDA National Championship Tournament in 2006, hosting 20 WFTDA leagues from around the United States in a tournament to determine the nation's first-ever WFTDA national champion team. We also hosted the 2007 WFTDA Western Regional Tournament, and we now hold an annual Dust Devil Tournament every year in April to bring skaters from around the WFTDA world to compete against one another. TRD is thrilled to be given another opportunity to host some of the best skaters in the world; our skaters, officials, and volunteers are ready to make your time in the Old Pueblo one to remember.

How To Get Here AND TRANSPORTATION AROUND TOWN

Located on US Interstate 10, home to an international airport and served by Amtrak and Greyhound, Tucson is easy to get to. Once you're here, rent a car, take a cab or bus, and ride our new modern streetcar. (For more transportation info visit http://www.visittucson.org/about/transportation

BY AIR:

The Tucson International Airport is located on Tucson Blvd in the southern portion of Tucson about 15-20 minutes (8-10 miles) from the venue and the rest of Downtown.

Tucson is served by six airlines with daily nonstop service to/from 15 destinations and connections around the world. Check flytucson.com for up-to-date information from Tucson International Airport Check our non-stop flights map http://www.visittucson.org/about/transportation/flight-map/

You can also fly into Phoenix, Arizona, and rent a car, taxi, or shuttle to make the approximately 110 mile trek east to Tucson (takes about 1 hour 45 minutes to get to downtown Tucson, depending on the traffic). Phoenix may provide a few more flight options, depending on where you are traveling from.

BY TRAIN:

The Sunset Limited Amtrak train line runs three days a week and connects Los Angeles to New Orleans with service to downtown Tucson. Downtown is also home to the Greyhound Bus station, open 24 hours all year long. Both the train station and bus station are located Downtown and are within a 5-10 minute walk to the venue.

BY CAR:

The Tucson Convention Center is located at 260 S Church Ave off of Broadway Blvd east of I-10 in Downtown Tucson. Any I-10 exit marked "Downtown", "Congress St" or "Broadway Blvd" should get you to the venue.

TAXI:

In many parts of Tucson, including downtown and the University area, you can walk to great dining, shopping, and entertainment, but you may want wheels while you're here. If you prefer not to rent a car, taxi and limo services can get you where you need to go. Shuttle services and charter services also offer convenient transportation to the airport and other locations.

Tucson's Sun Tran bus service offers more than 40 routes throughout the city and its outskirts, including 13 express routes. Learn more online or call (520) 792-9222 for route maps and schedules. Cash fares start at \$1.50 for a one-way ride.

Seating Information

SEATING INFORMATION

Seating is on a first come, first served basis. There will be stadium seating, track-side floor seating, and standing room sections. No reserved seating or VIP seating is offered for this tournament.

No carry-in chairs are permitted.

Chairs are not permitted trackside except as a companion to ADA accessible seating. Wheelchairs (and their companion chair) must be a minimum of five feet away from the outside referee line.

In order to sit trackside, you must be at least 18 years old. If you do not have a valid photo ID to verify your age, you will be required to move.

We expect high attendance at the tournament and seating areas to be full. Do not "save seats" for individuals who are not returning to their seats momentarily. You will be asked to remove skate bags, backpacks and other large items from the seating area in order to make room to accommodate others. Participant bags may be left in the participant-only area (locker rooms). Please be considerate and allow others to sit if a seat is not actively being occupied.

Sign in and lace Up!

REGISTRATION

Registration will be at the Riverpark Inn on Thursday, September 3, from 5:00 PM to 10:00 PM, at which time Skaters, Officials, and other credentialed participants will complete required paperwork and receive their tournament credentials.

Captains Meeting will be at the Riverpark Inn on Thursday at 8:00 PM local time (US Pacific). Officials Meeting will be at the Riverpark Inn on Thursday at 9:00 PM local time (US Pacific).

Credentials must be worn at all times in order to obtain access to the venue and to participant-only areas. There is a \$30 fee to replace lost or stolen credentials.

TRACK FLOOR, WARM-UP SPACE, AND WARM-UP TIMES

The venue will be open by 8:00 AM Friday morning for skaters and officials who wish to test the floor.

The regulation track takes up most of the auditorium floor so there will be no warm-up space aside from the actual track. Teams will be allowed to warm up on the track during the half-time of the game prior to their own, as well as in the 20-30 minutes before the start of their game.

TEAM ROOMS

There will be several locker room areas and these will be assigned based on the tournament schedule. Please note these rooms will be shared by all teams. Please leave the team rooms in better condition than you found them.

There will be designated areas to leave your gear when not assigned a locker room and these will be in credential-only areas. The Tucson Convention Center, the WFTDA, and Tucson Roller Derby assume no responsibility for items left unattended.

There will be designated areas for Officials, announcers, and credentialed photographers and media. Please clean up after yourselves since there are quite a large number of you using shared space.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

The WFTDA as tournament host provides trained, certified emergency medical responders should an injury occur on the track. These staff may be a contracted service, venue provided, volunteers, and and/or team/league professionals. Only the staffed responders working their current shift may go onto the track or players' benches to access or treat a Skater or Official. Once removed from the playing area, if the skater or official wishes to use their own medical provider, s/he may refuse additional treatment.

Team/League medical staff seeking to treat their Skaters on the track or bench must be part of, and sit with, the scheduled medical crew. For information on how to volunteer for the safety staff, please let your team's wrangler know so that they can notify the Safety Liaison. PLEASE NOTE: NOT ALL VENUES AND CONTRACTS PERMIT THE USE OF ADDITIONAL OR VOLUNTEER MEDICAL STAFF. The opportunity to participate in this capacity is not guaranteed and when not part of the prearranged schedule will not be permitted.

NFTDA Tournament Rules

GUEST CODE OF CONDUCT

- The Women's Flat Track Derby Association strives to provide a safe and satisfying event for everyone in attendance by seeking your compliance with our guest code of conduct. We ask for your assistance in creating an environment that is free of:
- Abusive or foul language and obscene gestures directed toward other guests, venue employees, tournament staff and volunteers, players, coaches, and Officials.
- Guests who are disruptive to the event or impair other guests' enjoyment.
- Intoxicated or drug-impaired individuals.
- Smoking, except in designated areas (located outside of the arena).
- Prohibited entry items such as outside food & beverage, weapons, non-service animals, air horns, vuvuzelas, megaphones, and laser pointers.
- Professional cameras, video cameras, and audio recorders are prohibited without prior authorization and proper credentials.
- Guests without proper authorization or credentials entering or attempting to enter restricted areas.
- Banners or signs that obstruct the view of guests, obscure sponsor advertising, contain objectionable subject matter, or are commercial in nature. The WFTDA and the venue reserve the right to remove any banner or sign at any time.

Guests not abiding by this Guest Code of Conduct are subject to ejection from the venue. In the event that you are refused entry into or requested to leave the venue for failure to comply with the Guest Code of Conduct or follow the venue regulations, you will not be entitled to a replacement or refund for your ticket. Entry to the venue shall constitute acceptance of the Guest Code of Conduct and venue regulations.

- Glassware, sharp objects, and other items deemed inappropriate, harmful or hazardous by tournament staff are not allowed in trackside seating.
- You must remain seated in the trackside seating area. Laying down is not permitted. Keep your hands, feet, and belongings behind the safety line at all times. Do not touch or grab Skaters or Officials who fall into trackside seating. If a piece of clothing or equipment falls onto the track, do not enter the track or safety lane to retrieve it.
- Fire lanes, exits, and walkways must remain clear.
- Certain areas of the track and venue are reserved for individuals who require special seating or perform specific game duties. They may obstruct the view of persons behind them. However, they are not able to move, sit, squat, or otherwise alter their position lest they not be able to complete their job function.

restaurant choices over the last few years. While Tucson is the Mexican food capital of the US, our city has a diverse population and its restaurants reflect that, from steaming bowls of authentic Vietnamese pho to several kinds of Middle Eastern cuisine. Vegetarians, vegans, and paleos eat very well here, as do folks who like nothing better than a juicy burger. Most of the places listed below are located close to the venue/hotels, and are easy to get to by walking, using the Tucson Streetcar, or driving a few miles.

MEXICAN AND REGIONAL CUISINE

Mercado San Agustin (100 S Avenida del Convento) - Located on the west end of the streetcar route, this marketplace features several shops, restaurants, and a farmer's market that is open on Thursday afternoons. Restaurants include - Seis Kitchen and Catering, La Estrella Bakery, Sonoran Sno-Cones, & Stella Coffee Bar. Tania's 33 (614 N Grande Ave): vegan, vegetarian, and meat taco and burrito options. Also killer breakfast burritos! El Guero Canelo (2480 N Oracle Rd or venture to South Tucson to 5201 S 12th Ave) - If you're a meat eater and haven't yet heard of the Sonoran Hot Dog, now is the time to try it! Also available are Sonoran style tacos and burritos. Barrio Cuisine - Native American Bistro (188 E Broadway Blvd) - Unique cuisine inspired by Tohono O'odham Nation and Pascua Yaqui Tribe. El Minuto Cafe (354 S Main Ave) - A hop, skip, and a jump from the venue! Standard Mexican fare. Try the cheese crisp! Martin's Comida Chingona (557 N 4th Ave) offers vegetarian, vegan, and meaty Mexican food in an artsy setting. El Charro Cafe (311 N Court Ave) - Established in 1922, El Charro is one of the nation's oldest mexican restaurants. They make their carne seca on the rooftop and claim to have invented the chimichanga! Tucson Tamale Company (2545 E Broadway Blvd) - Recently visited by Alton Brown on his tour through Tucson. Great tamales and sides with vegan and vegetarian options! A little farther away from venue (you'd have to drive here), but it's easy to take out and save for later!

AMERICAN FARE

Reilly's Craft Pizza and Drink (101 E Pennington St) -Built in a renovated funeral home, Reilly's also boasts an outdoor beer/wine garden and an underground speakeasy style bar called The Tough Luck Club. Lindy's on 4th (431 N 4th Ave) - Creative burgers such as the Mac and Cheese, Velvet Hammer (with a fried egg!), and the Blue Suede Cow (with peanut butter and bacon - sounds weird but it's surprisingly good!). Bison Witches (326 N 4th Ave) - Combination pub & sandwich shop known for hefty portions, bread-bowl soups, and happy-hour specials. The Hopyard Deli and Market (210 N 4th Ave) - The Hopyard is a full service deli and grocery market, specializing in grinders, salads, deli sides, and homemade desserts. La Cocina (201 N Court Ave) offers an indoor/outdoor cafe with vegan and vegetarian options, late-night happy hours, and live music performances. Also home to the Dusty Monk Pub. The Hub (266 E Congress St) - Homemade ice cream & New American fare headline at this spot. Cup Cafe (311 E Congress St) - Inside a circa-1919 hotel, this trendy American cafe serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner. **Cushing Street Bar and Restaurant** (198 W Cushing St) - Cafe serving traditional American fare in a circa-1860 adobe building with live jazz on Saturdays. Super close to the venue!

GLOBAL CUISINE

Cafe Desta (758 S Stone Ave) - Delicious Ethiopian fare - easy to share! Vegan, vegetarian, and meat dishes available. Casa Vicente (375 S Stone Ave) - Spanish tapas and paella - Flamenco dancing and music on Fridays and Saturdays! Miss Saigon (47 N 6th Ave) - Vietnamese food, including several pho, bun, and other choices. Yoshimatsu (2660 N Campbell Ave) - Several sushi, Japanese soups, and rice dishes to choose from!



LOCAL COFFEE

Sparkroot (245 E Congress St) - Blue Bottle Coffee, plus teas, sandwiches, salads, beer and wine. **Cafe Passe** (415 N 4th Ave) - Quaint, artsy cafe known for coffees, paninis, and pastries as well as poetry readings & live music. **Cartel Coffee Lab** (210 E Broadway Blvd) - Local coffeehouse chain with house-roasted beans in a chill surrounding.

BARS AND BREWERIES

Thunder Canyon Brewery Restaurant and Pub (220 E Broadway Blvd) - Handcrafted beers with typical bar style food. Barrio Brewing Company (800 E 16th St) - Rustic-chic brewpub with happy hour specials, shuffleboard, and up to 12 house beers on tap. Dragoon Brewing Company (1859 W Grant Rd #111) - This microbrewery has an on-site tasting room serving its craft beers, plus a food truck option. Tap and Bottle (403 N 6th Ave) features 20 tapped beers and 6 wines by the glass, plus a food truck option, as well as a full complement of beer and wine to go. Hotel Congress (311 E Congress St) was built in 1919 and has several drinking areas to choose from! Home to many famous ghosts, too. Playground Bar & Lounge (278 E Congress St) - Contemporary destination for DJ-spun tunes, snacks and cocktails. Scott & Co. (49 N Scott Ave) -Speakeasy style bar that consistently serves quality drinks. Surly Wench Pub (424 N. 4th Ave) - Lowbrow pirate themed bar. The Sunday after-party will be held here!

NEARBY GROCERY STORES AND OTHER AMENITIES

Johnny Gibson's Downtown Market (11 S 6th Ave) The closest option to the venue complete with a deli, 16 foot salad bar, bike delivery, and more! Food Conspiracy Co-op (412 N 4th Ave) Anyone can shop at this cooperatively owned organic grocery store, with a hot bar and salad bar. Safeway (1551 W St Marys Rd), and Fry's (555 E Grant Rd). CVS Pharmacy (825 E University Blvd & 865 E Grant Rd), Walgreen's (550 N Silverbell Rd & 730 E Grant Rd), and Target (1225 W Irvington Rd).

Tour the Mission San Xavier del Bac, a historic Spanish Catholic mission located about 10 miles south of downtown, on the Tohono O'odham San Xavier Indian Reservation http://www.sanxaviermission.org/. Within a 1-2 hour drive, you can explore more of the Old West in the towns of Tombstone and Bisbee, AZ. And if you have your passport, you can visit Sonora, Mexico, less than one hour away! 
