WASATCH ROLLER DERBY Salt Lake City, Utah



Wasatch Roller Derby (WRD) was formed in 2008 with the intent to create a travel team and a non-profit organization focused on giving back to the local community. Wasatch Roller Derby has grown from the mere vision of two individuals to a league of 50 skaters, many dedicated volunteers, and the most amazing officials crew! In the six years that WRD has been in existence they have grown from one travel team to an "A" and a "B" travel team and 3 home teams.

Some of Wasatch Roller Derby's accomplishments include: their first public bout April 25, 2009, where they raised approximately \$1,500 for the Utah chapter of the American Diabetes Association. From there, the league continued to grow and in June 2010 Wasatch Roller Derby was accepted into the Women's Flat Track Derby Association. In 2010, WRD also secured its own practice venue and focused on its next goal, WFTDA (then-called regional) Playoffs. In 2012, after a hard fought season including an amazing series of games at Boise's Spudtown Knockdown tournament, the season ended with an invite to Oakland for the WFTDA Western Regional Playoffs. In 2013, WRD headed to the WFTDA Division 1 Playoffs in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and now Wasatch Roller Derby is elated to be hosting a Division 1 Playoff tournament in Salt Lake City this year.





HOW TO GET HERE

BY AIR:

Salt Lake International Airport (SLC) is America's best airport, according to Travel + Leisure. Located just 4 miles from downtown Salt Lake, the airport is a major hub for Delta and Southwest Airlines, and both airlines offer non-stop flights from most major airports. Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, Frontier, jetBlu, SkyWest, United, and US Airways all serve Salt Lake International Airport, as well. The airport also receives direct international flights from Canada, Mexico, France, Italy, and Japan.

BY TRAIN:

Salt Lake City's Amtrak station is located right downtown, within walking distance to all hotels and the Salt Palace Convention Center. It is located at 340 South 600 West.

BY BUS:

Salt Lake City's Greyhound station is located downtown, within walking distance to all hotels and the Salt Palace Convention Center. It is located at 300 South 600 West.

UTA TRAX:

Once you arrive in Salt Lake City, a rental car won't be necessary - Salt Lake's light rail system, UTA Trax, runs from the airport to downtown, and the hotels and convention center are within a few blocks from the trax stations. The Convention District, which includes much of the downtown area, is a free-fare zone. The host hotels are within easy walking distance of the Salt Palace. Trax green line runs from the airport to downtown, costs \$2.50, and is only a 15-minute to 20-minute ride. The hotel is just a few blocks from the Courthouse (450 S Main) Trax stop.

BY CAR:

The Salt Palace Convention Center is located in the heart of downtown Salt Lake City, accessible by I-15 and the 600 South exit. The Salt Palace is located at 100 West Temple.

BY TAXI:

Getting around downtown Salt Lake is extremely easy, and most locations are within walking distance, or within Trax's freefare zone, but if you need a cab, there are three reputable cab companies to choose from. The average fare from the airport to the hotel/Salt Palace is about \$20 or less:

HOW TO GET TO THE HOTEL

BY TRAX LIGHT RAIL FROM SALT LAKE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Take the 20-minute Green Line ride from the airport to downtown Salt Lake City - exit Trax at the Courthouse (450 S Main) stop. Walk to the Sheraton just half a block south, and a block-and-ahalf west from the trax stop. Most downtown hotels are within easy walking distance to a TRAX stop. Cost: \$2.50 one way. Cash or credit cards accepted at the platform kiosks.

BY CAR:

From I-15 (north or southbound), take the 600 South City Center exit and go straight ahead to West Temple. Turn left on West Temple, to 500 South (500 South is a one-way street). Turn left on 500 South. The Sheraton hotel is located on the north (right) side of the street, halfway down the block.

The Sheraton is located just three blocks from the venue and just 15 minutes from the airport. The UTA Trax light rail is \$2.50 to/ from the airport to Courthouse Station, located a short walk from the hotel.

PARKING

The venue has two underground parking garages, and daily rates range from \$5 and up. The South Lot entrance is off of 200 South between West Temple and 200 West. The West Lost entrance is off of 300 West between 100 South and South Temple. We recommend that you stay at the host hotel and walk to the Salt Palace. In addition to parking on-site, there are also several independent pay lots around the venue.

SECURITY

There will be hired security personnel and volunteer security staff to attend to crowd control and general security matters. You are advised not to leave valuables unattended as neither the WFTDA, Wasatch Roller Derby, nor the Salt Palace Convention Center will be responsible for loss, damage or theft. Do not leave your property unattended.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

In additon to food and beverage on site, there are more than 170 restaurants, cafes, nightspots, and shops located in the convention district, all within easy walking distance, and many located just across the street.

EVENT TRANSPORTATION


The venue, restaurants, and after party location are all within walking distance of the host hotel and are within TRAX free-fare zone if you prefer not to walk.

SALT PALACE CONVENTION CENTER Hall E 100 South West Temple

The Salt Palace is located in the heart of downtown Salt Lake City, within walking distance to dozens of hotels, shops, restaurants and bars. With over 679,000 square feet of space, there's more than enough room for roller derby!

RULES AND RESTRICTIONS

- All purses, bags and cases are subject to search.
- State law prohibits smoking indoors and outside within 20 feet of building entrances. Smoking is permitted in designated areas only.
- Any item that is dangerous, hazardous and/or illegal or that may be used as a weapon, compromise or otherwise interfere with the enjoyment, comfort or safety of any person or pose risk to security at the venue, or any other item that WFTDA event officials or the Salt Palace officials determine (in their absolute discretion) may cause injury or public nuisance or inconvenience to any other person is strictly prohibited.
- No animals other than guide, signal or service animals (as defined by law) are allowed in the Salt Palace. All sanitary needs for permitted animals are the responsibility of the customer.
- Neither the Salt Palace, the WFTDA, nor Wasatch Roller Derby will be liable for any loss, damage or harm (of any kind, including to any person or any property) arising from your presence at the event and you agree that no claim, complaint or proceeding will be brought in this regard. You are responsible for any property you bring to the event and such property is at your own risk. Your presence and/or movement in and around the event is at your own risk.

SEATING INFORMATION


- Seating is on a first come, first served basis. There will be stadium seating and standing room sections. No reserved seating or VIP seating is offered for this tournament. No carryin chairs are permitted near the track.
- We expect high attendance at the tournament and seating areas to be full. Do not "save seats" for individuals who are not returning to their seats momentarily. You will be asked to remove skate bags, backpacks and other large items from the seating area in order to make room to accommodate others. Participant bags may be left in the participant-only area (locker rooms). Please be considerate and allow others to sit if a seat is not actively being occupied.

ENTRY AND RE-ENTRY

Doors open daily at 9:30 AM Games begin at 10:00 AM

Your tickets will be scanned and/or taken at the entrance to the arena. For same-day re-entry, you will need a wristband. Do not leave the arena without a wristband if you wish to re-enter.

REGISTRATION

Registration will be held on September 25, in the Sheraton lobby, from 4 PM until 10 PM, at which time skaters, officials and other credentialed participants will complete required paperwork and receive their tournament credentials.

Captains Meeting will be at the Sheraton on Thursday at 8:00 PM local time (US Mountain). Officials Meeting will be at the Sheraton on Thursday at 9:00 PM local time (US Mountain).

Credentials must be worn at all times in order to obtain access to the venue and to participant-only areas. There is a \$30 fee to replace lost or stolen credentials.

TRACK FLOOR, WARM-UP SPACE, AND WARM-UP TIMES

The Salt Palace floor is slick, smooth concrete. We recommend softer, sticky wheels. The venue will be open by 8:30 AM on Friday morning for skaters and officials to begin warming up. A separate, smaller warm up track will be available with warm up schedules to be announced.


MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

The WFTDA Emergency Action Plan requires the WFTDA, as tournament host, to provide trained, certified emergency medical responders should an injury occur on the track. Only the WFTDAprovided EMTs may go onto the track or players benches to access or treat a skater or official. Once removed from the playing area, if the skater or official wishes to use their own medical provider, s/he may refuse additional treatment.

TEAM ROOMS

Team "locker rooms" will be designated with pipe and drape. The area will be off limits to spectators and will be supervised throughout the day by security. Teams are advised not to leave gear overnight.

RULES AND CONDUCT



WFTDA TOURNAMENT RULES

- No video or audio recording devices or cameras with detachable lenses without prior approval from the WFTDA. Please visit wftda.com/tournaments/credentials for more information. Deadline for applying for photographer credentials is August 28, 2014.
- If you choose to sit trackside, you accept all responsibility for the possible risk of injury to you, or damage and/or destruction to your belongings at any time without warning. Trackside seating is at your own risk.
- You must remain seated in the trackside seating area. Keep your hands, feet, and belongings behind the safety line at all times.
 Do not touch or grab skaters or officials who fall into trackside seating. If a piece of clothing or equipment falls onto the track, do not enter the track or safety lane to retrieve it.
- Fire lanes, exits, and walkways must remain clear.
- Certain areas of the track and venue are reserved for individuals who require special seating or perform specific bout duties. They may obstruct the view of persons behind them. However, they are not able to move, sit, squat, or otherwise alter their position lest they not be able to complete their job function.
- By entering the venue, you agree to the possibility of being photographed, filmed or recorded. Your voice, image and likeness may be captured and recorded in and around the venue and publicly disseminated by any means and in any format or media. You waive all rights on an irrevocable, worldwide, perpetual basis to object to such recording and dissemination.

GUEST CODE OF CONDUCT

The Women's Flat Track Derby Association strives to provide a safe and satisfying event for everyone in attendance by seeking your compliance with our guest code of conduct. We ask for your assistance in creating an environment that is free of:

- Abusive or foul language and obscene gestures directed toward other guests, venue employees, tournament staff and volunteers, players, coaches, and officials.
- Guests who are disruptive to the event or impair other guests' enjoyment.
- Intoxicated or drug-impaired individuals.
- Smoking, except in designated areas (located outside of the arena).
- Prohibited entry items such as outside food & beverage, weapons, non-service animals, air horns, vuvuzelas, megaphones, and laser pointers.
- Professional cameras, video cameras, and audio recorders are prohibited without prior authorization and proper credentials.
- Guests without proper authorization or credentials entering or attempting to enter restricted areas.
- Banners or signs that obstruct the view of guests, obscure sponsor advertising, contain objectionable subject matter, or are commercial in nature. The WFTDA and the venue reserve the right to remove any banner or sign at any time.

Guests not abiding by this Guest Code of Conduct are subject to ejection from the venue. In the event that you are refused entry into or requested to leave the venue for failure to comply with the Guest Code of Conduct or follow the venue regulations, you will not be entitled to a replacement or refund for your ticket. Entry to the venue shall constitute acceptance of the Guest Code of Conduct and venue regulations.



In addition to a variety of offerings at the snack bar located within the venue, there are several restaurants within quick walking distance, most located right across the street:

TOASTERS is located across the street on the south side of the Convention Center, and is great for sandwiches, with vegetarian and vegan options. Toasters is open 7 days a week from 7 AM to 6 PM M-F, 10 AM to 6 PM Saturday, and 11 AM to 5 PM on Sunday.

City Creek Center is located across the street to the east of the Salt Palace, and restaurants include **BLUE LEMON**, **ELEVATIONS**, **THE CHEESECAKE FACTORY**, **BRIO TUSCAN GRILL**, and **KNEADERS CAFE**. City Creek Center is closed on Sunday.




